

HOW TO REGISTER

Reason Children Misbehave



Do you know that most children want to please their parents and caregivers? Rudolf Dreikurs, American Psychiatrist, said “that a misbehaving child is a discouraged child”. He believed there are four reasons children misbehave. Jane Nelsen who also studies children’s behavior believes that parents and caregivers often misinterpret the reason for a child’s misbehavior.

- The first reason children misbehave is to get **Attention**. Children want attention and they will get it anyway they can by displaying good or bad behavior. Parents and caregivers may misinterpret this behavior as the child is just trying to annoy them. Caregivers/parent should give every child in their care daily one on one attention.
- The second reason children misbehave is to get **Power**. When children are told what to do, when to do it, what to wear, what to eat, and how to eat, they are frustrated! The best remedy for this is to give the child choices. Make sure the choices you offer you can live with and doesn’t harm the child.
- The third reasons children misbehave it to get **Even**. If the child feels hurt because of verbal or physical abuse the child may want to strike back. If the child is looking for revenge, the parent/caregiver feels hurt.
- The last reason for children’s misbehavior is that they feel **Inadequate**. The child may not be ready for the task you asking him/her to do. If they can not complete the task, they are frustrated. The parent or caregiver may interpret the behavior as not being unable to help the child and may pity the child.

Next time you have a misbehaving child, find out what he or she is doing and try to figure out why. Be mindful of how you interpret the misbehavior. It’s important to try to understand why the child is misbehaving so you can take correct actions.

Class Descriptions:

Healthy Habits, Keeping Preschool Children Healthy – You will learn ways to promote good hygiene and nutrition with your children and recognize signs of abuse and neglect.

Going to School – In this class, Dr. Craig Ramey and Dr. Sharon Ramey’s research identifies how children learn, the hallmarks of children success in school, how to involve parents and caregivers in children’s education, and tips to encourage reading.

Children’s Temperaments: Flexible, Fearful, or Feisty: Children’s temperament should be taken into consideration in how they are guided. An understanding of temperamental differences can help caregivers work more responsively and effectively with individual infants and toddlers in their care. Each child has his or her own unique blend of temperament traits.

Ready, Set, Play! Creating an Active Environment for Young Children – You will learn how group games perform many functions. They can help in preventing childhood obesity and create an active environment that promotes healthy minds and healthy bodies. Group games can stimulate cognitive as well as physical development. Appropriate games in the early learning environment can build inclusion, take the focus off failure, allow each child to enter at his or her own level, help children share in a challenging experience, and provide an environment that is safe socially, emotionally, and physically.

1-2-3 Count on me, Numeration – You will learn about math and developmentally appropriate practices for children.

Fun in the Sun – This class will help you become aware of sun safety and summer fun ideas for children.
