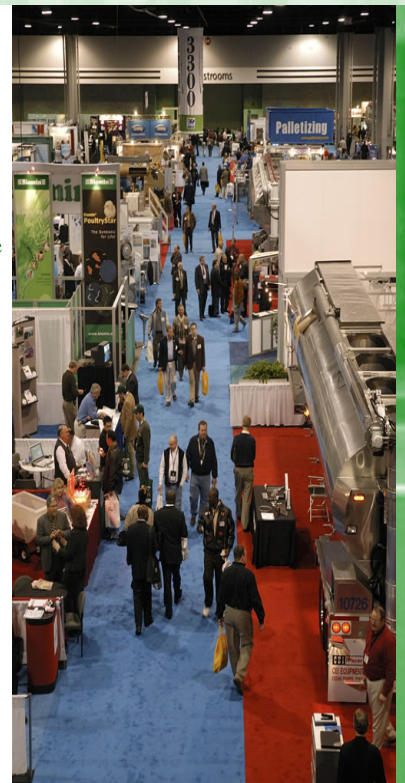

ATLANTA, Dec. 27, 2007 -- Poultry industry growers are invited to attend the next International Poultry Expo and International Feed Expo at a reduced rate. Growers who present a special coupon at the Georgia World Congress Center will be admitted for only \$5 (USD), a savings of \$45 off the on-site registration fee. Grower Days exposes growers to the latest technology for the poultry and egg industry.
